Financial FAQs – Higher Ed

If you are studying at the Higher Ed level (Bachelor Degree and above), you are able to pay for your studies at Tabor Adelaide in one of two ways:

1. You may take out a FEE-HELP or HECS-HELP loan prior to the Census Date for the subjects in which you enrol. These government loans are for the life of the course and allow you to defer payment of your tuition until you reach the income threshold set by the government. FEE-HELP is available for all Higher Education courses of study, but HECS-HELP is *only* available for students in Teacher Education. 2. If you choose not to take advantage of these loans, you can pay for your course by credit card, EFTPOS, cheque or cash **prior to the Census Date**. Payment details are listed on your Tax Invoice. If you are not eligible for Fee-Help or HeCS-Help and cannot afford to pay your fees in advance, you can request a fortnightly direct debit payment plan by speaking to our Finance Department.

Withdrawing from a subject prior to the Census Date may incur a penalty; for further information, please see Appendix 1 (page 14) of the Student Handbook: [Click here](#)

If you withdraw after the Census Date, the full subject fee is payable.

Financial FAQs – VET

If you are studying at the VET level (VET Certificate and Diploma), you will need to pay for your subjects as you study. An invoice will be issued to you a few weeks into the study period. You can either pay your fees in full *after* you receive an invoice, or you can arrange to pay your fees in instalments throughout the duration of the study period by speaking with our Finance Officer after you have enrolled in your subjects.

Please note: under the AQTF, we are not permitted to take fees in advance of more than \$1000.
